Monthly Technical Meeting

Introduction and Background

- ASSP-KC is following issues on process safety since its formation in 2000
- A major push was when Jack McCavit and Scott Burger visited ASSP-KC
- A deep dive PSM program was held in 2008
- A revisit made in 2018
- In 2019 the PSM Forum was established and PSM60 International Certificate course was held
- Since 2020 the Forum is holding its monthly technical meetings, attended by international audience
- Meetings are held online at 7 pm (Kuwait time) every third Wednesday of the month and each last for about 90 minutes
- Meetings are open to anyone from any part of the world can join after pre-registration

Meeting agenda

- 1. Call to order the chair calls the meeting to order and makes brief opening remarks
- 2. Introduction and background by the moderator
- 3. Ground rules
- 4. Presenter's intro 1 min., presentation 15 min, and Q&A 5 min
 - Case study presentation by an individual who is developing his competency. Generally a case of catastrophe, major disaster, or incident from where some good learning is derived.
- 5. Self-introduction of new members to the forum
- 6. Technical or organizational (PS Forum related) queries/suggestions raised by anyone to be answered by someone chosen by the moderator. May follow up with discussion and conclusion as appropriate. Preferably such queries/suggestions invited in advance before the meeting.
- 7. Presenter's intro 1 min., presentation 15 min, and Q&A 5 min
 - Experience sharing by an experienced individual (personal/close experience) what happened, what was wrongly done, what he will do differently if he has to do it again
- 8. Action plan responsibilities and deadlines, if any
- 9. Announcements of significant activities and events (report from the past month or upcoming)
- 10. Concluding remarks by the VP including pluses and deltas

Expectations

- Participate join the meetings regularly
- Participate ask questions
- Participate present your experiences or incident reminders
- Advocate encourage others in your network to join
- Get certified do the quiz and get attendance certificate that may help you in maintaining your credentials like CSP; and win prizes!
- Presentations
 - Keep it simple presentation slides are not always required
 - There are mentors and supporters to help and guide you
 - Will help others
 - Would help improve your understanding of the subject
 - Will add to your CV
