SAFETY TERM REWIND



Risk Analysis => Qualitative Vs Quantitative

Qualitative Risk Analysis: Qualitative risk analysis is the process of evaluating and rating an identified risk based on its severity and the likelihood of its consequences. The goal of qualitative risk analysis is to come up with a short list of risks that need to be prioritized above others.

Quantitative Risk Analysis: the process of calculating risk based on data gathered. The goal of quantitative risk analysis is to further specify how much will the impact of the risk cost the business. This is achieved by using what's already known to predict or estimate an outcome.



Quantitative Approaches	Qualitative Approaches
Results are based on objective measures	Results are based on subjective measures.
Cost and benefit issues are important	Monetary value of assets is not important.


