

Kuwaiti Women Conference in collaboration with Kuwait Society of Engineers (KSE)





Bow-Tie Analysis

The bow tie analysis methodology is used for risk control, safety, employee compliance management and risk method analysis, among others. Additionally, using the bow tie diagram provides the operational status of the controls that are in place to mitigate the severity of potential outcomes.

Bow-Tie Diagram Elements and Structure:



A bow-tie diagram is a graphic tool used to describe a possible damage process in terms of the mechanisms that may initiate an event in which energy is released, creating possible outcomes, which themselves produce adverse consequences such as injury and damage. The diagram is centered on the (generally unintended) event with credible initiating mechanisms on the left (being where reading diagrams starts) and resulting outcomes and associated consequences (such as injury, loss of property, damage to the environment, etc.) on the right. Needed control measures, or barriers, can be identified for each possible path from mechanisms to the final consequences. The shape of the diagram resembles a bow tie, after which it is named.

Before beginning any work at height, it's essential to inspect both your equipment (such as harnesses, lanyards, and anchor points) and the work area. This ensures that everything is in proper working condition and that there are no immediate hazards in the vicinity. Skipping this step can lead to equipment failure or unrecognized hazards, increasing the risk of falls and injuries.

2. Which of the following is considered an essential piece of personal protective equipment (PPE) when working at height?

C. Harness and lanyard

When working at height, fall protection equipment like a harness and lanyard is crucial. These pieces of PPE are designed to secure the worker and prevent falls by attaching them to a stable anchor point. Unlike other PPE like hard hats or safety glasses, which protect against different types of hazards, a harness and lanyard specifically address the risk of falling from height.

Fall protection is mandatory whenever working at height. Regulations and safety standards universally require the use of fall protection to ensure the safety of workers.


Fall protection must be in place for any work at height, meaning there is no allowable distance for a fall without protection. This stringent requirement is in place because even short falls can result in serious injuries. Proper fall protection equipment, such as harnesses, guardrails, and safety nets, is necessary to mitigate this risk.



5. Which of the following is a safe practice when using a ladder for working at height?

C. Ensure the ladder is on a stable, level surface

Ensuring that a ladder is placed on a stable, level surface is crucial for preventing it from tipping or slipping while in use. This is a fundamental safety practice that helps maintain balance and stability. Other unsafe practices, such as carrying heavy tools while climbing, standing on the top rung, or leaning the ladder against an unstable surface, can lead to loss of balance and falls, resulting in injuries.
